USDA Rural Development	Rural Decentralized Water Systems Grant Program (individual wells, septic)	This program helps qualified nonprofits create a revolving loan fund to increase access to clean, reliable water and septic systems for households in eligible rural areas. Seven Rivers Resource, Conservation, and Development (RC&D)	Rural Decentralized Water Systems Project (individual wells, septic)	The RC&D received \$200,000 in grant funds from USDA Rural Development to establish a revolving loan fund. Low-income homeowners can apply to borrow funds from RC&D to make repairs to wells and/or septic systems. The loan will be financed at 1% interest up to 15 years if necessary. Water Well Trust	Loan Program for Household Water Wells & Septic Systems (water wells, septic)	This program provides funding for water well and septic projects to rural households throughout the U.S. The intent is to provide long-term, low-interest loans to applicants seeking new or improved water wells, and for the first time in October 2021, septic systems. The Water Well Trust limits funding to a maximum of \$15,000 per system. Loans have an interest rate of 1% with terms of up to 20 years. http://www.waterwelltrust.org	Applications are accepted year-round. Applicants can contact Water Well Trust either by phone, email, or completing the interest form on the website. Georgia Department of Natural Resources, Environmental Protection Division	Section 319(h) Georgia's Nonpoint Source Implementation Grant (nonpoint, water quality improvement)	The Georgia Environmental Protection Division (GAEPD) receives an annual grant under Section 319(h) of the Federal Clean Water Act to help prevent, control and/or abate nonpoint source pollution in support of Georgia's Nonpoint Source Management Program. GAEPD then conducts a competitive process to fund eligible projects that will lead to direct reductions in pollutant loads and measurable water quality improvements in impaired waters throughout the State. In specific cases, the funded project MAY involve septic tank funding. Rural Community Assistance Partnership (RCAP)	Individual Household Well & Septic Loan Program (individual wells, septic)	The SERCAP Individual Septic Loan Program offers loans of up to \$15,000 to residents of rural communities to pay for the installation of a new standard or alternative septic system. Interest rates range from 3% to 6% based on the applicant's median household income and these loans are unavailable from other lending institutions. (The SERCAP Household Well Loan Program delivers low interest (1%) loans for up to \$11,000 to residents of rural communities with populations under 25,000 to cover the cost of digging a new well or repairing an existing well.) https://sercap.org/about/who-we-serve/programs-and-services-homeowners	Applications are received year-round. Applications can be accessed on the website.	Residence must be in an eligible rural area, town, or community in SERCAP's seven state service area. Applicants must own (or provide recorded Lifetime Rights) and occupy the home being improved. New home construction and community water systems are not eligible. Gwinnett/Walton Habitat for Humanity	Water Resources Assistance Program (WRAP) (septic)	Water Resources Assistance Program (WRAP) is a home repair ministry program offered through Gwinnett/Walton Habitat for Humanity in partnership with Gwinnett County Water Resources Department. WRAP provides plumbing services for low to moderate-income homeowners who reside within Gwinnett County service area. WRAP assists homeowners who are unable to complete plumbing repairs on their own due to age, finances, or physical ability.
